About Us

Misfits works in partnership with learning disabled artists to create daring, playful, original performance.

Our creative practice brings to life our mission – preventing social exclusion of people with learning disabilities and challenging perceptions through creative expression.

Working from stories and ideas inspired by lived experience and the personal perspectives of people with learning disabilities - our work comes from the heart.

Our members create poetry, film and performances. The work created is poignant, powerful and often uses humour to tackle taboo subjects underrepresented in wider society.

We find platforms for this work to be performed and exhibited widely, spanning poetry sharings, film screenings, print, online and live

performance, raising awareness of people with learning disabilities to over 2500+ members of public each year.

Our History

We evolved from a drama group at a local day centre formed in 2000 to an established Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) in 2016. Our mission is to improve the life opportunities and aspirations of people with learning disabilities, to challenge their discrimination in society, and to prevent them from becoming socially excluded.

Based at St Paul's Learning Centre since November 2023 (previously at Hamilton House 2010–2023), we currently have 200 individual members, who elect Trustees each year at our Annual General Meeting. Our core team includes 7 part-time staff including 2 co-workers (with lived experience) and 5 freelance facilitators.

We have a Steering Group bringing that brings together Trustees and members to oversee the planning and running of our creative sessions and collate feedback and evaluation from activities and performances. This ensures consistent monitoring of outcomes and a direct voice from our members at Trustee meetings, giving our organisation real direction.

What We Do

We develop and deliver activities to help people with learning disabilities enhance their creative practice, allowing them to share their stories and make an impact. We host affordable weekly workshops with experienced freelance artists that focus on expression through drama, poetry, movement, and wellbeing. Our members create, perform, and devise original work based on their experiences and interests. The resulting content and performances are heartfelt, funny, and moving.

Our creative exhibitions and performances have been featured all over Bristol, breaking down barriers for people with learning disabilities and increasing visibility in the mainstream art world. Our work has been showcased across Bristol venues, including The Wardrobe Theatre, Bristol Old Vic, Bristol Beacon, Central Library, Arnolfini, M-shed, Bristol Museum, Harbour Festival and featured on BBC Radio 4, Radio Bristol, and Bristol BBC news.

Our performing group has been providing unique and creative training and performances for the NHS, Bristol universities, and the Council since 2005. We deliver commissioned face-to-face training to 2,500 medical students and professionals a year in the Bristol area, addressing

challenging issues, like relationships and inclusion in the workplace, by describing how PWLDs want to be treated by the services they use and the professionals they meet. Our outstanding record and reputation are demonstrated by the awards we have received, like the UK Museum & Heritage Award for Education (2012), and the National Lottery Good Causes Award for the Nation's Favourite Arts Project (2013). We received an honorific mention at the Arts & Health Southwest Awards 2015 for our short film 'Confidential Inquiry into Premature Deaths of PWLD', which is used by the Royal College of Nursing, Royal College of Paediatrics, and the NHS 'Patient Stories Week of Action'.

Misfits is also widely known for running Bristol's only monthly club-night for PWLD since 2004 – The **Rhythm of the Night** (below). With an average of 100 PWLD, plus friends, each event held at The Trinity Centre offers a safe space where PWLD can dance, socialise, and have fun.

Trustee Role Description

Misfits Board of Trustees set our goals and policies, ensures that we observe good practices, and supports our staff and members.

[The current Board](#) comprises five members, each with specialist expertise relevant to Misfits, who oversee the charity and provide strategic advice to guide the development of our work.

We are at an exciting stage of the charity's development, and we are looking to appoint new Trustees with diverse backgrounds to join our Board, to help ensure the charity continues to have maximum impact as well as oversee the fantastic work being undertaken by our dedicated paid staff, members, and supporters.

We would love to hear from people with a whole range of experience. In particular, we would love to hear from you if you have experience in any of the following areas:

- Theatre, Film, Poetry, Dance and Participatory Arts
- Disability and Access Awareness
- Human resources and/or employment law
- Public relations and/or communications
- Accountancy and/or financial risk management

We are interested in increasing the diversity of our Board, so we are particularly keen to hear from individuals from all areas of the community. Experience co-working with people with learning disabilities and/or of working with small-to-medium sized charities and/or arts organisations, and good contacts in the Bristol area would also be helpful.

We are an Equal Opportunities Employer and apply the same standards to recruiting Trustees. You do not need prior Board experience to become a Trustee, and we welcome applications from younger and Global Majority or BAME candidates.

The roles are voluntary and unpaid, and you will be required to become a Member of Misfits, sign a Declaration of Eligibility, and undergo a DBS Check as part of your induction.

You will be reimbursed for expenses incurred in your role such as travel to attend meetings or events on behalf of Misfits.

The commitment includes preparing for and attending at least four trustees' meetings a year and participating in sub-committees where appropriate.

What We Expect from You

You will oversee the charity's responsibilities to report to the Charity Commission, Companies House, and HMRC, and will also share a broader responsibility for Good Governance with the rest of the Board, including:

- Overseeing our long-term strategy
- Ensuring legal compliance with rules and regulations
- Managing financial risk, by reviewing the budget and financial practices
- Managing reputational risk, by overseeing the Charity's strategy and activities
- Managing risk to Members and Staff, by ensuring the presence and practice of appropriate internal governance mechanisms.

With this in mind, we expect from you:

- Commitment and enthusiasm to promote our work and help PWLD
- Integrity – all Trustees, Staff, and volunteers are DBS checked
- The ability to think strategically
- Good written and verbal communication skills
- The ability to motivate and work with people from different backgrounds

- An understanding that we are a small charity with limited resources and that Trustees may need to help with many different tasks.
- Be available for at least four Board meetings during your tenure.

What You Can Expect from Us

- A warm welcome!
- An induction process, including the chance to meet our staff, and members and attend some of our regular activities.
- A 'buddy' trustee to support you for the first four months
- A review meeting with the Chair after you have attended three Board meetings
- The opportunity to make a real difference in the lives of people with learning disabilities. Your skills and commitment will serve to enrich the capability of the Board and move Misfits forward toward the achievement of its vision.
- Access to training and development opportunities.

Meetings and time commitment

Trustees are officially appointed at our AGM in November and normally serve a three-year term, with the opportunity for re-election if they wish to continue.

The Board currently meets quarterly at St Pauls Learning Centre, 94 Grosvenor Road, St Paul's, Bristol BS2 8XJ. Meetings begin at 4.00 PM and usually last two hours though we could review this once the new Board is in place.

In addition to attending Board meetings, you will need to allow time for preparation and follow-up from meetings, as well as specific activities for which you could be responsible. This might be attending Misfits activities or doing a bit of research for the Board.

Each month is different, but an average commitment of 2-4 hours per month is required.

Although not a paid role, we will aim to refund any out-of-pocket expenses. Alternative arrangements for face-to-face meetings can also be accommodated.
